<u>Update 03-31-2023</u>		
The Passages' YOUth group meets weekly and brings issues to the NE FYSPRT. Weekly, we post to the NE FYSPRT social media site and while we note that there is online engagement, this does not convert to individuals who are willing to attend the monthly meetings.		
In early March, due to weather we had to cancel a planned parent/caregiver/youth NE FYSPRT dinner and information night. Construction at Passages is creating access issues from April through May; so, another event will be planned in early summer.		
<u>Update 06-30-2023</u>		
Due to ongoing construction at Passages that did not end until June 30, 2023, we will not be able to hold a Self-Care Fair given the extreme heat and wild fire smoke NE Spokane experiences in July and August.		
Outreach to families and youth was conducted this quarter by attendance of the NE FYSPRT tri-lead at the annual Pride Month Event in Spokane. Information about the NE FYSPRT was distributed to over 200 individuals. Additionally, 100 NE FYSPRT brochures were handed out at the annual Washington Behavioral Health Conference in June.		

<u>Update 09-30-23</u>
Outreach activities this quarter include attendance at Disability Awareness, Goodwill Resource Fair at a local high school, Spokane County Fair, and Spokane Impact behavioral health resource fair.
<u>Update 12-31-23</u>
We held a parent/youth event in October and 35 NE FYSPRT swag bags were handed out. In December the youth tri-lead attend the "Parade of Lights" an annual suicide awareness event held in Spokane Valley, WA and organized by a high school youth. Approximately 50 NE FYSPRT swag bags were handed out at the event.

<u>Update 03-31-2023</u>		
During this reporting period, representatives from three new and innovative programs for children and youth presented at the NE FYSPRT meetings.		
As part of the monthly discussion regarding strengths and challenges in the local system, the Medicaid funded transportation vendor, Special Mobility Services (SMS) was once again identified as having unsafe practices when picking up and dropping off children and youth accessing Apple Health funded behavioral health services. Providers who have tried to work with SMS to resolve these issues report unsatisfactory resolution including not receiving support from the HCA identified Medicaid transportation manager.		
<u>Update 06-30-23</u>		
A formal Challenges & Solutions form was submitted to the Sate FYSPRT regarding the continued safety issues brought forward regarding SMS.		
<u>Update 09-30-23</u>		
The SMS issue was vetted at the State FYYRT and underfunding of the program was presented as the basis for many of the issues. A local SMS employee is attending the NE FYSRT meetings. While improvements have been minimal, the SMS employee agrees improvements need to occur.		
<u>Update 12-31-23</u>		
SMS update- As per a notice from the State FYSPRT, there is an additional funding package proposed for the Medicaid Transportation program. As per staff that manage the Medicaid Transportation program at HCA, the additional funding should help to eliminate some of the issues of concern that were brought forward by the NE FYSPRT. It is also noted that anecdotal reports from local providers indicate improvements in the local SMS Medicaid funded broker of transportation services.
